## Ram Epididymitis (Brucella ovis)



## What it is -

- Brucella ovis (B. ovis) is a bacterial disease that affects sheep.
- *B. ovis* is an economically important cause of epididymitis, orchitis, and impaired fertility in rams.
- A flock infected with B. ovis may experience decreased pregnancy rates due to ram infertility, abortions, and increased lamb mortality at lambing time.

## Control -

- The sheep industry and the Animal Industry Board implemented a Ram Epididymitis (B. ovis) control program in 1988.
- The program consists of interstate and intrastate regulations and a voluntary B. ovis Free Flock certification.
- The main component of the program is testing of rams.
  - ❖All rams 6 months of age and older must test-negative for *Brucella ovis* or originate from a *B. ovis* Free Flock prior to sale, movement to another operation, or importation for any purpose other than immediate slaughter or feeding for slaughter.
