

Trichomoniasis

Requirements



No testing is required if the animal(s) moves directly to a feedlot or an approved slaughter facility.

Health Certificate and Import Permit Requirements – See General Requirements.
Bison are exempt.

Bulls

Any bull moving for breeding must have negative test results and the date noted on the CVI.

The following statement is required on the CVI for Bulls

“The bull(s) identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been tested and found to be negative for trichomoniasis by testing conducted by a laboratory accredited by the American Association of Veterinary Laboratory Diagnosticians.”

Approved Test: Organism isolation or PCR.

Exemptions for testing of Bulls (Status must be noted on the CVI)

Virgins Bulls.

Exhibition or Rodeo Bulls – must be confined to prevent breeding.

Bulls from a farm/ranch having an approved SD AIB agreement.

Risk Assessment Considerations for Bulls: contact the Animal Industry Board.

Bulls – held in confined dairies.

Bulls - moving to designated grazing areas.

Females

Non-Virgin, Non-Pregnant females are prohibited from entering the state.

Exceptions

Non-Virgin, Non-Pregnant females entering before rebreeding and accompanied by their pre-weaned calf.

Contact the Animal Industry Board for risk assessment considerations—

Females registered with an approved Breed Registry.

Females moved into a confined Dairy.

Donor Females used for Embryo Transfer.
